Work must come second to study and is thus limited to 964 hours per year and 20 hours per week.

The minimum wage in France (SMIC) is set at €9.4/hour net.

An internship exceeding two months has to be compensated. The net salary is €4.35/hour.

Only EU students and non-EU students undertaking the OFII procedure have permission to work.

OPEN A BANK ACCOUNT IN FRANCE

A French account is necessary to:

- Apply for the CAF housing allowance
- Buy private insurance
- Sign up for a mobile phone/internet plan

Documents needed to open a bank account:

- Birth certificate and its translated version
- A photocopy of your passport
- A housing contract from CROUS, residence, or landlord

FRENCH GOVERNMENT SCHOLARSHIP

FRENCH INCOME TAX

All foreign students who have a professional activity and who receive income from a French source are subject to income tax.

Please note that in France, completing a tax declaration is mandatory. However, it is not necessarily followed by a tax payment.
